

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, LOS ANGELES

The University of California, Los Angeles, better known as UCLA is the most applied-to university in the nation because of its renowned reputation. UCLA is consistently ranked



among the world's top-tier universities and it is powered by extensive resources. Centered in one of the most influential cities in the world, UCLA is considered an international university that is diverse and progressive.

In total, UCLA offers 125 majors and 80 plus minors. The top five most popular undergraduate majors are political science, psychology, biology, business economics and history.

The average GPA for admitted incoming freshmen is 4.25, with an SAT score between 1760 and 2140. Almost all, 94%, of freshmen live on campus when attending UCLA. In addition, 55% of UCLA undergraduates receive some sort of financial assistance.
